TERMS

1. IESF: International Esports Federation
2. NF: National Esports Federation– a national organization made in an appropriate legal form that complies with national legislation and IESF criteria as the esports controlling body for a single country
3. General Meeting: Means the General Meeting as contemplated in Article 20 of the Statutes.
4. Board: Means the Board of the IESF as contemplated in Article 27 of the Statutes.
5. Confederation: An alliance of NFs, which are situated at the same continent or at a geographic region, recognized by the IESF.
6. Committees: The IESF has subsidiary committees, which are Player, Referee, Disciplinary, Competition, Finance and Technical Committee.
7. Member: A NF that has been admitted into membership by the General Meeting
8. Esports Player: Esports player registered to the NF
9. President: President represents IESF and Chairman of the General Meeting and the Board.
10. Vice President: Vice President represents IESF in the absence of the President
11. Secretary General: Secretary General represents the Secretariat, and in charge of all day to day affairs for business of IESF.
12. Majority: The Majority shall be 50% of those entitled to vote plus one.
13. Secretariat: The office of the IESF shall be as contemplated in Article 1 and 40.

Chapter I. General Provisions

Article 1 Name, Headquarters and Branches

1. International Esports Federation (IESF) is an international governing body for esports - and all its disciplines, which is established by, and consists of, its members, and is registered under the laws of the country where the Secretariat is based.
2. The IESF Secretariat shall be located in Busan, Republic of Korea, and may move to or open a branch in a different city and country as the Board decides.

Article 2 Objectives

The objectives of the IESF are:

1. To constantly improve esports and promote it in the light of its values - humanitarian, educational, cultural, unity of purpose and ability to promote peace;
2. To encourage and support the promotion of ethics in esports as well as education of youth through esports and to dedicate its efforts to ensuring that, in esports, the spirit of fair play prevails and violence is banned;
3. To encourage and support individuals, Members, Confederations and other entities affiliated with Confederations and Members, in the development and coordination of esports competitions;
4. To develop and to preserve the independence of esports, and to not tolerate government interference in any of its members;
5. To support and harmonize the culture and education with esports;
6. To organize its own international competitions and to draw up regulations and provisions and ensure their enforcement.
7. To ensure good governance of NFs by taking appropriate steps to prevent the infringements of the Statutes, regulations or decisions of the IESF.

8. To promote integrity, ethics, and fair play with a view to prevent all methods or practices, such as corruption, doping or match manipulation, which might jeopardize the integrity of matches, competitions, players, officials and members or give rise to the abuse of NF.

Article 3 Title and Legal Personality

1. The IESF shall have perpetual succession and shall continue to exist notwithstanding changes in membership and office-bearers.
2. The IESF shall own property and other possessions separate from its Members.
3. The IESF shall be able to be sued in its own name.
4. The IESF shall exist in its own right separate from its Members.
5. That in order for the IESF to defend its status as a *Universitas*, no Member shall carry on any business with the object of the acquisition of gain.

Article 4 Official languages

1. English is the official language for minutes, correspondences and announcements.
2. Members are responsible for translations into the languages of their respective countries.
3. English is the official language at all official meetings including the General Meeting and the Board. Qualified interpreters shall translate into this language. Delegates may speak in their mother tongue if they ensure interpretation into English by a qualified interpreter.
4. The Statutes, Regulations governing the Application of the statutes, the Standing Order of the General Meeting, and the decisions and announcements of IESF shall be published in English. If necessary for administrative matter, as considering of the civil code of the country where the Secretariat is located, then, such publication may be made in the respective language of such country.

Article 5 Non-discrimination and Promoting Female Participation

1. The Practice of esports is a fundamental right for all.
2. All parties related to the IESF's events including its Members and partners shall take all appropriate measures to eliminate discrimination against women, and to promote and elevate the participation of female players in order to ensure, on a basis of equality of women and

men, the same rights, in particular, to participate in recreation, leisure and sports activities and all aspects of cultural life.

3. Discrimination of any kind against lineage, gender, religion, politics, individual, organization or any reason is strictly prohibited and punishable by suspension or expulsion.

Article 6 Promoting friendly relations

1. The IESF shall promote friendly relations;

1-1. between Confederations, Members, Officials and Players.

Every person and organization involved in esports is obliged to observe the Statutes, regulations and the principles of fair play.

1-2 in society for humanitarian objectives.

2. The IESF shall provide the necessary institutional means to resolve any dispute that may arise between Members, Confederations, Clubs, Officials and Players.
3. Members must respect each other's sovereignty. A Member shall not interfere in internal affairs of another national federation, unless requested to do so by such Member.

Article 7 Doping and Drug Use

1. The IESF, including its Members and players, are bound by the relevant rules and guidelines prescribed by IOC, Sport Accord, WADA, and other relevant agencies or bodies set up for monitoring drug use and doping by players affiliated with IESF Members.
2. The Competition Committee, with medical expert as appointed by the Board, shall decide from time to time the list of prohibited substances and methods of doping control that are applicable to esports in IESF competition, in accordance with IESF's Anti-Doping Rules based upon the WADA Code.

Article 8 Arbitration

1. In addition to other general provisions of the Statutes, any dispute arising from, or related to the Statutes and the occasion in connection with IESF events, other than a dispute arising out of the Statutes or a dispute that can be resolved by the Competition Committee and the Board of IESF, shall be submitted to the Court of Arbitration for Sports (CAS), in Lausanne, Switzerland, in accordance with its Statutes and Regulation to exclusion of any national court.

The parties to such dispute shall undertake to implement in good faith the arbitral result rendered by the CAS.

2. All disputes initiated by Members and partners of IESF shall be in English.

Article 9 Financial Year

1. The Financial Year of the IESF will be reckoned from 1 January to 31 December of each year.
2. All donations shall be reported separately, and shall be disclosed to public on IESF's official website detailing the donor and amount of each donation on an annual basis. Such disclosure shall include details of how such donation was applied.

Chapter II. Membership

Article 10 Admission

1. The General Meeting shall decide whether to admit a Member.
2. Any organization which is responsible for, or related to, esports in its country may become a Member of IESF.
3. Any Member in good standing may participate in the IESF's affairs.
4. Any organization wishing to become a Member of the IESF shall apply in writing, addressed to the IESF Secretariat.
5. Membership rights shall commence immediately upon approval of the General Meeting.
6. The classes of Membership of the IESF are:
 - a) Full Members
 - b) Associate Members
 - c) Affiliate Members

whose admission has been approved in terms of Statutes.

7. Each country may be represented by only one Member in the IESF. An organization may not apply to become a Member of the IESF as a NF if another NF already represents that country as a Member.

Article 11 Request and procedure for application

1. An organization which is not yet a Member of IESF and willing to join the IESF may apply for Membership of the IESF. The candidate shall submit the application, which formulated by IESF to IESF Secretariat in writing at least 1 (one) month prior to the commencement date of the Ordinary General Meeting at which the application is to be considered. Through the pre-evaluation of IESF Secretariat as to the bona fides of any applicant under the direction of the Board, the submitted application shall be placed on the General Meeting's Agenda.
2. The applicant shall present their application at the General Meeting. The application procedure shall be finalized by approval of the General Meeting, and it may decide the candidate whether to obtain Full Membership in accordance with decision of the General Meeting.
3. The new Member shall acquire rights and duties of Full Membership or Associate Membership or Affiliate Membership as soon as it has been admitted.

Article 12 Full Membership

1. An organization, having the structure of a NF, whose membership qualification has been approved by the General Meeting obtains Full Membership, and shall be called a Full Member.
2. A Full Member shall satisfy following requirements:
 - 2-1. Prove that it is organized on a national basis.
 - 2-2. Have a structure consisting of provincial, regional or club bodies that are geographically well distributed
 - 2-3 Show reasonable effort to be recognized by its own Nation's Government.



- 2-4 Show reasonable effort to be recognized by its own Nation's highest sports authority
- 2-5 Hold annual National Championships
- 2-6 Have a Constitution.
- 2-7. Allow any player ordinarily resident within the NF's country to register to the existing structure
- 2-8 Furthermore, it will be required from a Member to represent without discrimination, its participants in organized participation.
- 3. Full Members have the following rights:
 - 3-1. To a voice and one vote each in General Meetings
 - 3-2. To propose Motions for the General Meeting and request information from the IESF
 - 3-3. To participate in the activities and competitions organized by the IESF
 - 3-4. To organize, host or support any event approved by the IESF
 - 3-5. To use information and sources of the IESF without any discrimination
 - 3-6. To participate in the decision-making process
- 4. Full Members shall have the following obligations:
 - 4-1. To comply fully with Statutes and regulations of the IESF at all times
 - 4-2. To comply fully with directives and decisions of the governing body of IESF
 - 4-3. To comply with decisions of the General Meeting and the Board
 - 4-4. To pay membership subscription and other necessary fees levied by the General Meeting or the Board
 - 4-5. To comply fully with all other duties arising from a lawful decision of the IESF
 - 4-6. To submit the Annual Return and all supporting documents
 - 4-7. To attend the ordinary General Meeting.
- 5. Violation of the obligations stated in para.4 by any Full Member may lead to sanctions or punishment in accordance with Article 18.

Article 13 Associate Membership

- 1. An organization falls under the category below may obtain Associate Membership, and may be called as an Associate Member.
 - 1-1. National Esports Organization: an organization fulfilling the roles of NF but which is not satisfying the equivalent requirements to be the subject of appropriate Full Membership
- 2. An Associate Member shall satisfy following requirements:



- 2-1. An Associate Member shall host and operate esports tournaments and events in its own nation to select representative players to be sent to IESF's international tournament events.
- 2-2. An Associate Member shall share vision and purpose which the IESF supports
- 2-3. An Associate Member shall promote and support IESF and its businesses as following all the directions regarding the relationship with IESF.
- 2-4. Associate Membership may be granted by the Board when the general assembly is not in session. Associate memberships shall be reviewed annually by the Board.
3. Associate Members have the following rights:
 - 3-1. To a voice in the General Meeting, but shall not have the right to vote
 - 3-2. To propose Motions for the General Meeting and request information from the IESF
 - 3-3. To participate in the activities and competitions organized by the IESF
 - 3-4. To organize, host or support in any event approved of by the IESF
 - 3-5. To use public information and sources of the IESF without any discrimination
 - 3-6. To participate in the decision-making process for the IESF matters as observers, but shall not have the right to vote
4. Associate Members shall have the following obligations:
 - 4-1. To comply fully with Statutes and regulations of the IESF at any time
 - 4-2. To comply fully with directives and decisions of the IESF
 - 4-3. To comply with decisions of the General Meeting and the Board
 - 4-4. To pay membership subscription and other fees levied by the General Meeting or the Board
 - 4-5. To comply fully with all other duties arising from a lawful decision of IESF
 - 4-6. To meet the requirements to be promoted to a Full Member within the approved time-frame set by the Board
 - 4-7. To submit the Annual Return and all supporting documents
5. Violation of any of the obligations stated in para.4 by any Associate Member may lead to sanctions in accordance with Article 18.
6. When an Associate Member fully complies with the requirements to be promoted to Full Member status, such Associate Member can request an evaluation in order to be promoted to a Full Member. Such Full Membership can only be conferred by the General Meeting.



Article 14 Affiliate Membership

1. Where the Board is aware of an organization that fulfills the criteria of being esports related but cannot be accepted into Membership, then the Board may have the authority to admit such organization into Affiliate Membership under the following conditions:
 - 1-1. Such organization may attend General Meetings with no voting right, and;
 - 1-2. Such organization shall have no claim on the IESF

Article 15 Membership subscription

1. Each Member of the IESF shall pay the membership subscription annually to the IESF Secretariat in accordance with the decision of the General Meeting.
2. Membership fee is due on March 31 every year.
3. Membership subscription shall be used for the development of IESF or esports.

Article 16 Honorary Member

The General Meeting may, upon a proposal by the Board, grant the title of “Honorary President” or “Honorary Member” respectively to a person for their outstanding services to IESF. They may attend the General Meeting, but do not have the right to vote.

Article 17 Indemnity

The Board and all other office-bearers of the IESF are hereby through, and by means of, the funds and property at the IESF indemnified from and against all losses, claims, costs, compensations and other costs and obligations which they may incur or meet with regard to or in relation to the execution of their various obligations as office-bearers of the IESF, and



none of them shall be held responsible for any action of neglect on the side of any one of them or for a shortage or inadequacy of any proprietary right or security, and they are also not held responsible for any loss that may be caused, accident that may occur or damage that may be done or that may arise in the execution of their various official duties or as a consequence thereof: provided, however, that any such loss, accident or damage was not caused by action in bad faith or by deliberate negligence of such office-bearer.

Article 18 Reward and punishment of Member

1. A Member who is dedicated to the IESF may be rewarded under decision of the Board.
2. Where the Secretariat has asked for information from members, and have given such members at least 21 days of notice, a member shall be automatically suspended until such information has been furnished should the date for the submission of such information be exceeded.
3. Violation or negligence of the Member's obligations and duties may lead the relevant Member to sanctions, fines, suspension or termination of Membership under decision of the Board.
4. When Membership has been terminated by the Board, such Member shall not have its Membership reinstated until one calendar year has elapsed. Membership subscriptions and any levies already paid shall not be refunded to such Member.
5. The Board entrusted with the authority may take disciplinary action, such as suspension or termination of Membership, against a Member who has:
 - 5-1. Violated the Statutes or regulations, and is negligent in abiding by the decisions by the General Meeting and the Board
 - 5-2. Not complying with the IESF's objectives and bringing the IESF into disrepute.
 - 5-3. Absence at the General Meeting or activities hosted by IESF without good cause.
6. In any case of disciplinary action, the Board shall provide opportunity for a Member to represent itself at the General Meeting or via a written letter.

Article 19 Withdrawal of Membership

1. When a Member attempts to withdraw from Membership, the Member shall submit a written application of withdrawal in accordance with the procedure of admission
2. A Members' Membership shall be automatically terminated if such Member dissolved, was liquidated, discontinued or any related problems.

Chapter III. General Meeting

Article 20 General Meeting

1. The General Meeting is the legislative body composed of IESF's Members which Board, Associate, Affiliate and Honorary Members may attend the General Meeting as observers.
2. The President shall be the Chairperson of the General Meeting. Should the President not be present, the Vice President shall be the Chairperson. And should the Vice President not be present, then the General Meeting shall name any member of the Board in attendance as the Chairperson. If no Board member is present, the General Meeting shall name the Chairperson from among the person present.
3. Guests may attend the General Meeting but only upon invitation by the Board. They may not interfere in the General Meeting unless explicitly asked to do so by the Chairperson of the General Meeting.

Article 21 Decisions by General Meeting

The following decisions may be made at any General Meeting:

1. To confirm the minutes of the previous General Meeting.
2. To receive and adopt the Annual Report of the Board.
3. To consider and deal with any notices of motion to amend the Statutes.



- 3-1. The General Meeting, may alter amend, or revoke any of the Statutes of the IESF, or motion, if a notice of motion in writing, setting out such proposed alteration, amendment or revocation, shall have been given to the Secretariat and circularized to all affiliated Members not less than twenty-one days prior to such meeting. No such resolution shall become effective unless passed by 2/3 of the Members present and eligible to vote.
4. To approve the budget and receive and adopt the Annual Financial Statements of the IESF
5. To receive and adopt annual business plans of the Board
6. To consider applications for affiliation, withdrawal and qualification of Members.
 - 6-1. The General Meeting shall have the power to fine, reprimand or suspend any Member, which has been guilty of violating or neglecting the Member's obligations.
7. The General Meeting shall be empowered to deal with all matters arising out of or incidental to the proper management or control of the affairs of the IESF or of the activity itself, not provided for in these Rules.
8. The IESF may be dissolved should this be supported by a two-thirds majority of those eligible to vote at the General Meeting once the following criteria have been met:
 - 8-1. Notice of the proposed dissolution must be in writing, and circularized to all Members.
 - 8-2. Assets are to be realized by Members delegated to the task.
 - 8-3. Funds and assets remaining after the settlement of any debts shall be donated to a non-profit organization that pursues objectives near identical with IESF's.
 - 8-4. A statement detailing assets realized and donated, and how the proceeds of realized assets were disposed of shall be submitted to Members.

Article 22 Kinds and convocation of General Meeting

1. General Meeting means ordinary and extra ordinary meetings of IESF Members
2. The Ordinary General Meeting shall be held once each year.
3. The Ordinary General Meeting shall be held not more than 6 months prior to commencing the financial year end with preference given to holding such General Meeting at the same time as the World Championships.
4. The Board shall fix the date and place of the General Meeting. All Members shall be notified in writing at least thirty days in advance of the date, venue and agenda.

Article 23 Extraordinary General Meeting

1. The Board shall convene an extraordinary General Meeting within 30 days if:
 - 1-1. There is a written request by two-thirds of the Members for such a meeting to be held.
 - 1-2. 50% of the Board members submit a written request for such a meeting to be held.

Article 24 Quorum in General Meetings

Any General Meeting duly convened according to the definition herein shall have a quorum, independently from the number of Members in attendance. All decisions shall be adopted by two thirds of the votes of the Members present and eligible to vote.

Article 25 Eligibility to participate in General Meeting

A Member who is not in good-standing at the time of a General Meeting shall not be eligible to vote nor have any speaking rights at such meeting.

Article 26 Vote, delegates

1. Each Member has one vote in the General Meeting and is represented by its delegates.
2. A delegate must belong to the Member that they represent and be appointed by the appropriate body of such Member, and cannot represent more than one Member.
3. The Chairperson shall conduct the General Meeting in compliance with the Standing Orders of the General Meeting.
4. A member of the Board cannot be a delegate of a Member federation.

Chapter IV. Board

Article 27 Board

The Board shall deal with all business of the IESF and consists of President, Secretary General, Vice President, 4 Board members and the Chairperson of Player's Committee.

Article 28 Convocation of the Board

1. The Secretary General shall convene the Board under following situations:



- 1-1. when considered necessary by any of the Board members
- 1-2. Request from the 50% of Members
2. The Secretary General shall fix the date, place and agenda, and notify all Board Members within the period of 5 to 30 days of any request for such a meeting. All Board Members shall be notified via electronic mail.
3. A Member has a right to have a representative at a Board session that concerns the activity of such Member, but without a vote
4. The President shall be the Chairman at all Board meetings. Should the President not be present, the Vice President shall be the Chairperson, and should Vice President not be present, then the Board meeting shall name the Chairperson among the Board members with voting rights.

Article 29 Quorum in the Board

1. The Board shall be quorate when the majority of the Board members are present. If within half an hour (30 minutes) from the time appointed for any meeting of the Board, a quorum is not present, the meeting shall stand adjourned to the same time next day and at the same venue. If at such adjourned meeting there is not a quorum present; the Board members then present shall be entitled to proceed. Any decision made without a quorum is valid, but such decision must be approved at the next Board meeting.
2. All the decisions in the Board shall be adopted by Majority vote (50%+1). Whenever the votes are equal, the Chairman shall have a casting vote.
3. Board meetings may be held in person or on the internet.
4. Proxy votes shall not be allowed.
5. The Board may take decisions by circulation, e.g. via email to all Board members stating the time period in which they may answer. Upon receipt of a simple majority (50%+1) from Board members eligible to vote the motion is carried or denied. A casting vote is not possible as no chairperson is determined for such a decision.

Article 30 Powers of the Board

The Board shall consider and resolve the followings:



1. To review all motions to amend the Statutes as submitted by members. The Board shall then present all such motions together with its recommendations to the Ordinary General Meeting.
2. Articles related to sanctions and termination of Membership
3. To elect the Vice President, and employ the Secretary General, and removal of Board members, and co-option of Board members. Removal of any Board member shall require a two-thirds vote, and the Board member shall have right of appeal to a General Meeting.
4. To consider and discuss the operation of the IESF Secretariat, budget plan, amendment of office rules, personnel operation, business plan, and others, which shall be proposed by the Secretary General in writing at the beginning of the financial year in general, and may be amended at any time by the Secretary General upon approval being granted by the Board.
5. Articles authorized by Statutes
6. The decisions of the Board shall take immediate effect and shall be acted upon.
7. To decide on all cases of dispute not definitely provided for in these Statutes.

Article 31 Assignment of Board Members

1. President shall be a registered member of a Full Member in good standing, and shall be nominated by such body, and elected by the General Meeting. Candidacy of President shall meet all of the following criteria:
 - 1-1. No person may stand, or be co-opted on, for the position of President who has not already completed a full term of office in IESF for which they were elected;
 - 1-2. Recommended by at least one-third of Members; and/or
 - 1-3. Recommended by a majority of the Board members.
2. Vice President shall be elected by the Board among the elected Board Members.
3. Each Board member shall be a registered member of a Full Member in good standing, and shall be nominated by such body, and elected by the General Meeting.
4. Should a vacancy occur on the Board, for whatever reason, the Board shall be entitled to appoint a new Board member by co-option and interim until the next General Meeting. A new Board member shall be elected by the General Meeting for the remaining term of such office.



5. The Election of new Board Members should be held at the Ordinary General Meeting being held in the last year of the incumbent Board members' term of service.
6. Each National Federation can nominate a maximum of one (1) candidate for the Board.
7. No National Federation may have more than one (1) member elected to the Board at a General Meeting.

Article 32 Terms of Board Members

1. Board members' terms of office shall be 3 years. Board members may be re-elected to serve consecutive terms.
2. Board members' terms shall begin from the day after the Ordinary General Meeting which has elected the Board member, and shall end with close of the first Ordinary General Meeting after 3 years.

Article 33 Removal and resignation of Board Members

1. A Board member may be removed by approval of the Board under the conditions below:
 - 1-1. Conducting any violation against the Objectives of the IESF.
 - 1-2. Becoming embroiled in controversies which lead IESF into disrepute or are found guilty by a court of law of financial mismanagement.
 - 1-3. Conducting obstructive acts to the IESF.
 - 1-4. Missing events hosted by the IESF for two years without obtaining leave of absence.
 - 1-5. Dissolution of corresponding NF
2. Resigning due to private or any inevitable circumstances. Any such letter of resignation shall be submitted to the President.

Article 34 Duties of Board Members

1. The President shall be responsible for:



- 1-1. Acting as the Chairman of the General Meeting and the Board, and shall represent the IESF at official functions
- 1-2. Overseeing the implementation of the decisions passed by the General Meeting and the Board
- 1-3. Supervising the tasks of the IESF
- 1-4. Ensuring harmonious relationship between the IESF, Members, political bodies and international organizations
- 1-5. Proposing the dismissal of Board members
- 1-6. Any additional powers of President shall be contained in the rules of the IESF
2. The Secretary General shall be responsible for:
 - 2-1. Being the Chief executive of the Secretariat
 - 2-2. Making proposals to be approved or rejected by the Board or the General Meeting for IESF's yearly operation including finance, business plans and personnel operation
 - 2-3. Operation and management of the Secretariat and execution of the tasks as decided by the General Meeting and the Board
 - 2-4. Accounting and operational management.
 - 2-5. Relation with Members and committees
 - 2-6. Performing all tasks in general on behalf of the IESF.
3. The Vice-President shall be responsible for:
 - 3-1. In the absence of the President, to assume the duties of the President
 - 3-2. To act as ex-officio of any local organizing committee which organizes any IESF's event

Article 35 Compensation of Board Members

Compensations for President, Board members and other Committee Members for part time service shall not be paid. Only actual expenses for duties shall be paid.

Chapter V. Secretariat

Article 36 Secretariat

1. The Secretariat is the business operating body, and conducts the administrative works.
2. The Secretariat is composed of Secretary General and other employees as decided upon by the Bard.
3. The Secretary General is responsible for organizing and the operation of the Secretariat.
4. The Secretariat shall be responsible to the Board of the IESF.

Chapter VI. Confederations

Article 37 Formation of Confederation

1. Members of IESF that are situated at the same geographic region may form and join a Confederation of the region.
2. Each NF which joins a Confederation shall have equal rights and obligations toward the Confederation as its' other members.
3. Confederations shall be formed under the certain conditions as following:
 - 3-1. A Confederations shall consist of three or more IESF Members
 - 3-2. More than 50% of members of a Confederation shall consist of IESF Members.
 - 3-3. A Confederation shall cover a geographic region with population more than 200 million people.
 - 3-4. Statutes and other regulations of a Confederation shall not conflict with these Statutes, any minutes of the General Meeting or the Board.
 - 3-5. Each Confederation is obligated to contribute to the development fund, and the size of the fund that is resolved by the Board.
4. The Board may add other conditions for creating Confederations and their activity. Such decisions are obligatory for Confederations.
5. Any formation of a Confederation shall be conducted under approval of the Board.

Chapter VII. Additional clause



Article 38 Interim Measures

Action of Members and Board members taken before enforcement of these Statutes shall be considered as taken in accordance with these Statutes.

Article 39 President's Signature

In order to establish IESF, its Statutes must first be drafted and then the President shall sign it.
